Who We Are?

Fix in Art is an independent cultural organisation and creative community space based in Epanomi, Greece. Originally established under Anazitites Theatrou, the organisation has grown into a vibrant intercultural hub that brings together art, community building, youth empowerment and non-formal education. Today, Fix in Art operates as an open and welcoming community for young people from different cultural and social backgrounds.





What We Do?

We host a diverse programme of artistic residencies, youth exchanges, volunteering projects, workshops, festivals and community-driven initiatives. Through these activities, young people, artists, educators and activists come together to learn, co-create and share experiences. Each year, Fix in Art works with around 120 international volunteers, demonstrating strong experience in coordination, logistics and intercultural hosting.



Our Values & Approach

Our work is rooted in inclusion, creativity, sustainability and active citizenship. We create safe spaces where young people can express themselves, develop new skills and actively participate in shaping initiatives. Through extensive experience in Erasmus+ and European programmes, we promote intercultural dialogue, green practices, digital creativity and human rights education.



Our Space

Fix in Art has recently moved into its own permanent cultural premises, strengthening its autonomy, community identity and long-term vision. Today, the space functions as an open house for collective learning, artistic experimentation, co-creation and European collaboration.



Why Epanomi?

Epanomi is more than just our location; it is the heart of our community. Surrounded by nature and strong local ties, it offers an inspiring environment for personal growth, collective living and sustainability. Fix in Art continues the vision of its founder, Dionisis Zafeiridis, who dreamed of a space where people could freely explore creativity and rediscover their passions in life.

We offer workshops, events and exhibitions across various artistic disciplines such as painting, music, dance, sculpture and more. We believe that art is a powerful tool for self-expression and social connection. Volunteers and participants are encouraged to explore their creative paths while contributing to a shared, collective process.

Current Activities of Fix In Art



Save the food

Volunteers reduce food waste by sorting produce, cooking, preserving food and co-creating the Fix In Art community cookbook.



No food waste

Together with NGO Social Plate, we rescue unsold produce from local markets and donate it to more than 50 support organisations in Thessaloniki.



Beach Cleaning

We organise regular beach clean-ups in Epanomi, followed by creative workshops that recycle or repurpose waste through hands-on environmental learning.



Urban gardening and farming

Volunteers help maintain a shared vegetable garden while learning the basics of sustainable farming and community-based food production.

Current Activities of Fix In Art



Language Cafe

A casual and interactive space where participants can learn new languages directly from native speakers, encouraging cultural exchange and community bonding.



Skill share activities

Volunteers and community members share practical skills—from arts and crafts to digital skills and cooking—fostering mutual learning.



Creating Awareness

Volunteers design and deliver awareness campaigns on recycling, Erasmus+ and youth initiatives, presenting them at major summer festivals.



Fix InSide

Volunteers help improve community spaces through repainting, redecorating and repurposing rooms for exhibitions, workshops and creative residencies.

Current Activities of Fix In Art



Recording Lives

Volunteers conduct interviews and collect personal stories to document local life in Epanomi and strengthen community connections.



Upcycling & Recycling

Volunteers run upcycling workshops, support sustainability projects and manage recycling at events as part of our zero-waste approach.



Clearing Day

Once a week, volunteers take part in a creative construction and clean-up day to improve the space, remove waste and enhance the project's visual identity.



Mentoring

Once a week, we hold mentoring sessions that focus on both personal development and community well-being. Mentoring is a space for reflection, growth, and connection — for learning not only about the world, but also about ourselves.

Living Spaces

Rooms

Volunteers stay in shared rooms with minimum two and maximum 6 people. Each room is furnished with wardrobes, a chest of drawers, tables, chairs and bedside lamps. If volunteers need additional materials for their room or for project-related activities, coordinators are available to support and provide necessary resources.

Kitchen & Meals

Cooking is done collectively on a rotating basis. We provide three shared meals per day:


- Breakfast: 09:00 – 10:00
- Lunch: 14:00 – 15:00
- Dinner: 19:30 – 20:30

Meals are usually eaten together in the kitchen or garden. Volunteers are expected to respect shared spaces, contribute to cleaning routines and help maintain a tidy and welcoming living environment.


Bathrooms



If you are afraid of dogs, that is completely okay—you are not expected to take part in dog-related activities. You can always choose a different task or join another volunteer.

If you have allergies, please remember to bring any necessary medication with you.



Important to Know

Activities may change depending on the season.

- In summer, there are more outdoor events such as festivals and concerts.
- In winter, we mainly focus on indoor activities like info days, language cafés and skill-sharing sessions.

If you are coming in summer, don't forget sunscreen, swimwear and towels.

If you are coming in winter, bring warm clothes—yes, it's Greece, but it can still get cold!



Daily Life & Practical Info

- Volunteers work 5 days per week and have 2 days off
- (days off may occasionally change depending on the workload).
- Bedsheets, duvets and pillowcases are provided.
- Please bring your own towels.
- Cleaning equipment for shared spaces is provided.
- Personal items and special needs should be brought by volunteers.



Getting Around

To move around Epanomi, volunteers can use shared bicycles. Just coordinate with the community coordinators to borrow one. We encourage sustainable and eco-friendly transportation whenever possible.

Community Life



